

SEVENCHURCH

Right now many people are wondering where underground metal will head next - I mean speed/thrash eventually burnt out in the late '80's and the same fate is inevitable for death metal one day. Some think industrial will be the next big thing. Others though are forecasting a return to the origins of heavy metal, the classical heaviness of pioneers like BLACK SABBATH and the N.W.O.B.H.M. combined with more contemporary sounds. This forecast can already be well evidenced in recent albums from CATHEDRAL, TIAMAT, SOLITUDE AETURNIS, STILLBORN, CONFESSOR and THY GRIEF ETERNAL. ...add to this growing list Oxford band SEVENCHURCH. Call it doom, call it just plain heavy metal, call it what you like...the sound is slow, oppressive, rich in texture and about as mind-numbingly heavy as you can get.

SEVENCHURCH are label-less at this stage but must surely be on the verge of a deal in the wake of their awesome '92 demo "Nefarious". Containing two songs, both clocking in at over 84 minutes, it is classic doom; balancing heaviness and a sense of dark foreboding with poetic lyrics and mesmerizing melodies. It is not, however, overly derivative or cliched - take for example the vocal style of eccentric front man Martin Spear (ex-MADAMADAM). His voice is totally unique and quite unsettling. I must admit it took me a while to get used to him but, as with CATHEDRAL's Lee Dorrian, this initial scepticism is soon won over. He is backed by some effective deathly vocals from bass payer "Ollie" who is also responsible for the highly literate lyrics of the two tracks, "Circus Divine" and "Twilight Of Evergreen".

SEVENCHURCH were formed in early 1990 by highly respected Oxford lead guitarist David Smart. He was joined by Ollie (bass/vocals), Dave Capel (rhythm guitar), and Grahaeme Bastable (drums). The original four-piece line-up SEVENCHURCH fell into place in the English spring of 1991. They made their live debut in support of MADAMADAM on the 12th of August. Ironically MADAMADAM broke up soon after and singer Martin made the move to SEVENCHURCH because Ollie had grown uncomfortable with handling both bass and vocal duties. The new five piece SEVENCHURCH line-up

made their debut in fine style supporting deathgrind "Gods" CARCASS in a gig on the 6th of December 1991.

The new year saw things start to happen for the band with the release of the "Nefarious" demo to broad critical acclaim in both underground and mainstream press. METAL FORCES' Malcolm Dome had this to say in the March '92 issue; "...the best demo I've heard in ages...a true discovery. Someone should sign them up right away and get them working on a full album. I cannot recommend this tape highly enough". Never has a magazine writer spoken truer words! Any self-respecting fan of bands like SAINT VITUS and COVEN should seek out "Nefarious" without delay. Even the BBC were impressed with it, playing all 9 minutes 22 seconds of "Circus Divine" on their "Friday Rock Show"!

So now you're wondering how to obtain this minor masterpiece, right? Well, just send a money order or bank draft for £5.00 (made payable to Paul Oliver) to the address shown below. Sevenchurch "Nefarious"

This is another great demo tape, this time at the other end of the spectrum. You may have heard of the singer, Martin Spear from another UK band Madamadam who were allegedly of an Anthrax/Madonna influence (Phew! Sure am glad I didn't check them out!) whom he quit not so long ago for this classic doom outfit.

You get two tracks on "Nefarious" their debut demo. "Only two?" I hear you cry. Yes, just the two but if I were to tell you that the demo is 19 or so minutes long, you quickly get the message! The tracks are "Circus Divine" and the better of the two being "Twilight Of Evergreen" which has an eerie little acoustic piece in it. As far as doom vocals go, you can't just say "Yeah, they've got your typical doom vocals" because I can't describe them. Are they vocals like My Dying Bride's or like Solitude Aeternus? Well in this case, the vocals are mellower than a lot of bands with one or two (and I mean one or two) short bursts of the death metal vocals here and there. Q HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE YOUR MUSICAL STYLE AND OUTLOOK/WHAT INFLUENCES YOU THE MOST/ARE LYRICS IMPORTANT TO YOU?
We describe the SEVENCHURCH sound as "magnificent morose malevolence". Lead guitarist David Smart writes all of the music and influences come from far and wide. Much of what he writes is inspired by well executed heavy atmospheric films such as Eraserhead, and well executed heavy atmospheric music from the likes of BLACK SABBATH, MERCIFUL FATE, JUDAS PRIEST, LYNYRD SKYNYRD and THE ALMOND BROTHERS. Bass player Ollie has written all their lyrics to date and they are mainly based on personal experience stories which are very important to him. His influences range from anything from Anne Rice Novels (yes, well good stuff-Ed) to well constructed lyrics! Q YOU OBVIOUSLY TAKE A LONG TIME CONSTRUCTING YOUR SONGS. DO YOU HAVE ANY USUAL SONGWRITING PROCESS?
There is nothing particularly unusual about the SEVENCHURCH song writing process. The music always comes first-taking however long it takes. No song is ever planned to last longer than 5 minutes, it's just the way it happens.

Q HAVE YOU RECEIVED ANY LABEL INTEREST/WHAT ARE YOUR FUTURE RECORDING PLANS?
After the recent exposure on "The Friday Rock Show", BBC RADIO ONE, coupled with the glowing demo review in METAL FORCES, the record companies are beginning to take notice. Future recording plans are therefore dependent on the outcome of this record company interest.

Q DO YOU CONSIDER YOURSELF A LIVE BAND OR ARE YOU MORE SUITED TO A STUDIO ENVIRONMENT?
Playing live is an extremely enjoyable experience-being in the studio is an extremely annoying experience (that is an EXTREMELY annoying answer-agitated Ed).

Q WOULD YOU EVER ENLIGHTEN A KEYBOARD PLAYER TO FEELING YOUR SOUND?
No plans at the moment to recruit a keyboard player, but that is not to say that we would like to see one on stage. The only song as yet recorded did not clutter our sound.

SEVENCHURCH are a truly excellent doom band from the fetid depths of Oxford, and with this incredible offering have earned themselves a well deserved place up there with their melancholy contemporaries CATHEDRAL and WINTER. Although the tape contains only two tracks, the total running time almost reaches twenty minutes, both songs overflowing with melodramatic pomposity and morbid orchestration that sets them apart from the aforementioned bands, but also draws on them for musical inspiration, especially in the case of CATHEDRAL. The voice of Martin Spear is the perfect complement to SEVENCHURCH's unique style of doom metal, leaving a lasting impression with each twist and turn of his individual vocals.
